Focus

The Intensive explores the vision and practices for 21st century faith formation that can guide a congregation in developing faith formation for all generations, taking into account the diversity of people's life situations, needs and spiritual yearnings.

2.20pm John Roberto - "A New Ecosystem for 21st Century Faith Formation" (Part 1)

Why do we need a approach to faith formation in the 21st century and what might this new approach look like? A faith forming ecosystem has five elements - intergenerational faith formation, family faith formation, age group faith formation across the life cycle, missional faith formation to the unaffiliated and uninvolved, and digitally-enabled and digitally-connected faith formation.

7.15pm John Roberto - "Becoming an Intentionally Intergenerational Community"

Intergenerational faith formation and whole community faith experiences are at the center of the new faith forming ecosystem. People learn by participating in the life of a community. Practices of faith are taught through the interrelationships of worship, learning, service, ritual, prayer, and more. A faith forming education that is centered in the life of the Christian community is intrinsically an intergenerational experience. This session explores the theory, research, and principles of intergenerational faith formation; and examples for becoming intentionally intergenerational in a congregation.

9.40am **John Roberto - "Families at the Center of Faith Formation"**

The family is the single most important influence on religious transmission and faith practice, as show in research studies, the Christian tradition, and pastoral experience. The faith of parents and grandparents, their role modeling, their teaching, their warm and affirming parenting style are key factors in religious transmission and developing faithful children, youth, and young adults. In the new faith-forming ecosystem, congregations seek to equip families as centres of faith formation developed around three essential elements. Congregations equip families to become centres of learning and faith growth at home by 1) nurturing family faith at home, especially through faith practices; 2) strengthening family life by developing family assets; 3) developing the faith life of parents and grandparents; and 4) developing the knowledge, skills, and confidence of parents (and grandparents) for parenting.

Sessions 6 and 7 explore how to develop lifelong faith formation that addresses the unique life tasks, needs, interests, and spiritual journeys of age groups from childhood through adulthood. The two sessions present effective practices and approaches for faith formation at each stage of life, and specific ways to utilize 21st century methods for designing and delivering faith formation, including how to utilize multiple settings—self-directed, mentored, at home, in small groups, in large groups, church-wide, in the community and world; and in online learning environments.

Session 8 explores missional faith formation by understanding the research and experience of people who are unaffiliated or spiritual but not religious or "done" with established churches. It presents missional faith formation approaches that expand and extend the church's presence through outreach, connection, and relationship building; and that provides pathways for people to consider or reconsider the Christian faith, to encounter Jesus and the Good News, and to live as disciples in a supportive faith community.
